

In maths we will be learning how to:

- count from 20 to 50, in ones and by making groups of ten.
- learn to partition numbers into tens and ones; estimate on a number line to 50
- continue to build on our understanding of one more and one less.
- compare lengths and height.
- measure length using objects and are introduced to using rulers to measure length in centimetres.
- investigate the concepts of heavier / lighter and full / empty.
- measure and compare mass, volume and capacity

In computing our topic is Digital Writing

We will learn to use a computer to write by:

- opening a word processor
- recognise keys on a keyboard
- identify and find keys on a keyboard
- Adding and removing text
- explore the toolbar
- make changes to text

In English our text will be: The Sea Saw

While reading these we will learn how to:

- say a sentence orally before writing it
- identify and use the suffix -ed
- Use the prefix -un
- use a range of adjectives when writing
- Sequence the main events in a story
- Join words and clauses using 'and'
- write a diary



In PSHE our puzzle is Healthy Me.

We will learn about the differences between healthy and unhealthy choices and how to make healthy choices. We will learn about keeping clean, germs, disease and illness. We will discuss how to use medicines safely and how to keep safe when crossing the road.

In Music our topic is 'Pitch (superheroes)'

We will be identifying high and low notes, Children will use this knowledge to compose a simple tune that represents a superhero. They will listen to different pitches, recognising the difference between high and low sounds. After identifying these notes, pupils will experiment with combining different pitches to create a melody that represents their chosen superhero.

In history our topic is Transport Through Time

We will learn about types of transport that can be found in Croydon today and compare this to other types of transport that can be found in the UK today. Identify some of the purposes of each type of transport and compare the trams that are currently used in Croydon to those from 1900-1951. We will compare the trains of today at East Croydon Station to trains from the 1930s and learn about George Stephenson's achievements. The children will learn how developments in public transport have changed national life including how the Croydon transport system impacted transport systems elsewhere in the UK.

In art our topic is Textures and 3D form

We will learn how to:

- use a **range of materials creatively** to design and make dragon eyes
- to use **drawing, painting and sculpture** to develop and share ideas, experiences and imagination
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- We will learn about the work of Bridget Riley and Jackie Morris.

In PE our topic is Send and Return
